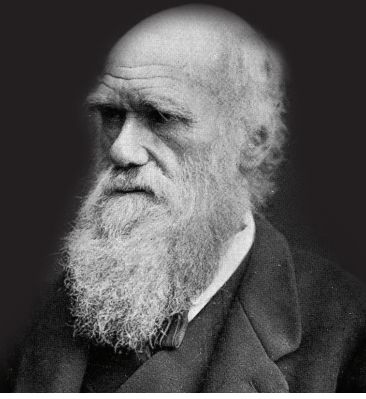

## From Cave Walls to Web Pages: The Power of Communication to Change the World

Genevieve von Petzinger is a Canadian paleoanthropologist. Her research focus is cave art painted by early humans in Europe between 10,000 and 40,000 years ago, specifically the geometric signs found at many of these sites. Von Petzinger explores how these signs can help us to better understand the early human cognition, communication and use of symbolism. Her work has been widely featured in national and international media outlets and academic publications. She was selected as a TED Senior Fellow in 2013.
