

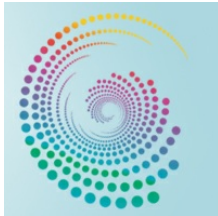

Did You Know?

The CCTS received a record response to its **2019 Interdisciplinary Network Pilot Program**, which aims to support projects that address health disparities and the cardiometabolic, vascular, cancer, and other health conditions that disproportionately affect populations across the Alabama, Louisiana, and Mississippi region. Of the 45 pre-applications received, 21 were from CCTS Partner institutions, representing 8 of the 11 Network members. All pre-applications were vetted by representatives from the Network and Hub. Twenty-three applicants have been invited to submit Full Applications, which are due October 31. The CCTS Pilot Program Steering Committee hopes to make final award recommendations in December 2018. CEI 2018 Announces Call for Posters

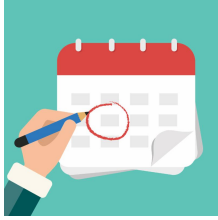

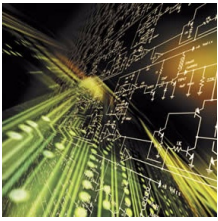
