Did You Know?

The Center for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) has released **a proposed rule to advance interoperability and patient access to health information**. The suggested policy changes support the goals of the **MyHealthEData initiative**, which aims to promote electronic data exchange and care coordination in the healthcare system and to ensure CMS beneficiaries have full access to their own health information and the ability to decide how their data, a rich resource for observational and interventional research, are used. In addition, CMS has issued related RFIs addressing patient safety and coordination of care and data exchange across health care settings. Comments on the proposed rule will be accepted through May 3, 2019. [More](#)

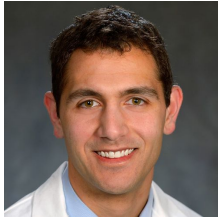

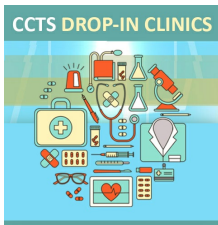
