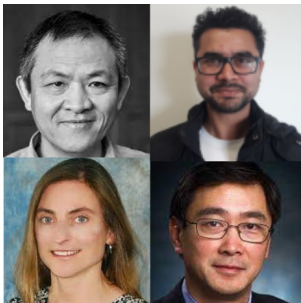
What's on the Agenda for the CCTS Translational Training Symposium?
