Attend the UAB Informatics Institute's 4th Annual Data Science Hackathon on August 5th & 6th

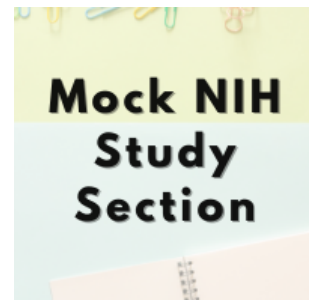
