






DATA INTEGRATION

- Obtain geo-location based on residential address
- Using GIS software and StreetMap Premium, assign geo-identifiers (FIPS codes) to addresses
- Download SDH data for FIPS codes, link to patient data
- HIPAA compliant, highly accurate




STATISTICAL ANALYSIS

- Statistical analysis and model development
- Generalized linear mixed models
- Generalized estimating equations
- Robust standard errors with regression




