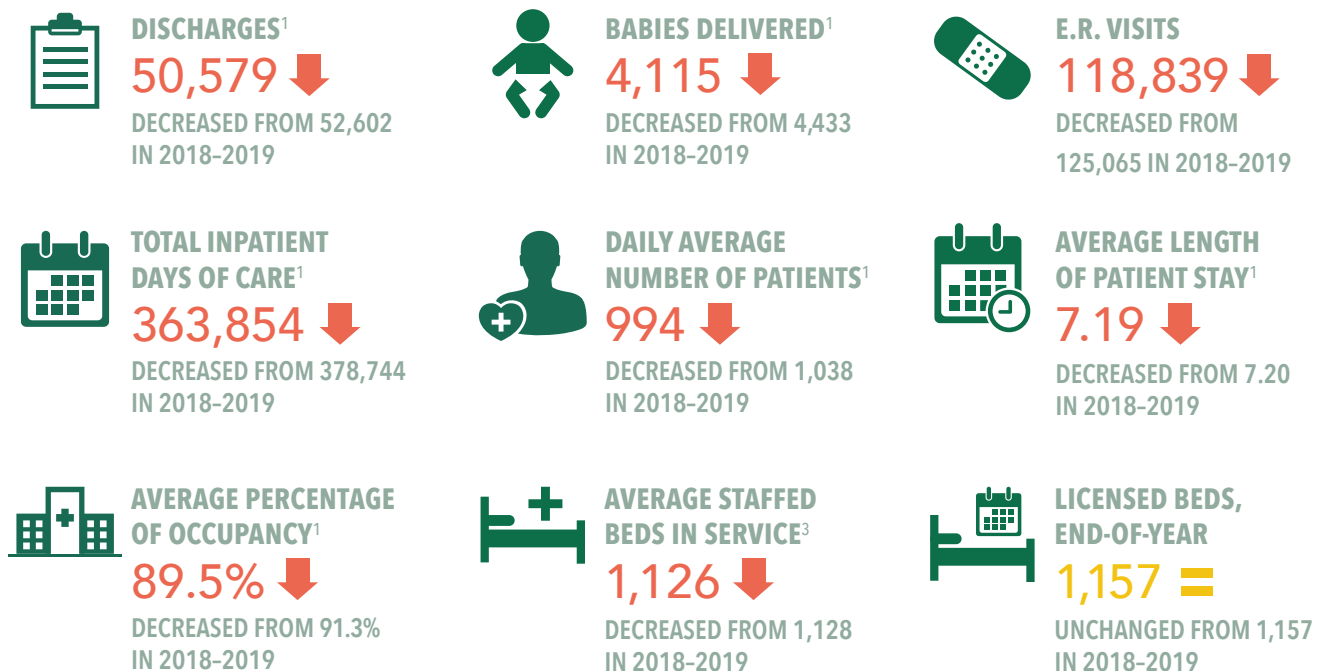

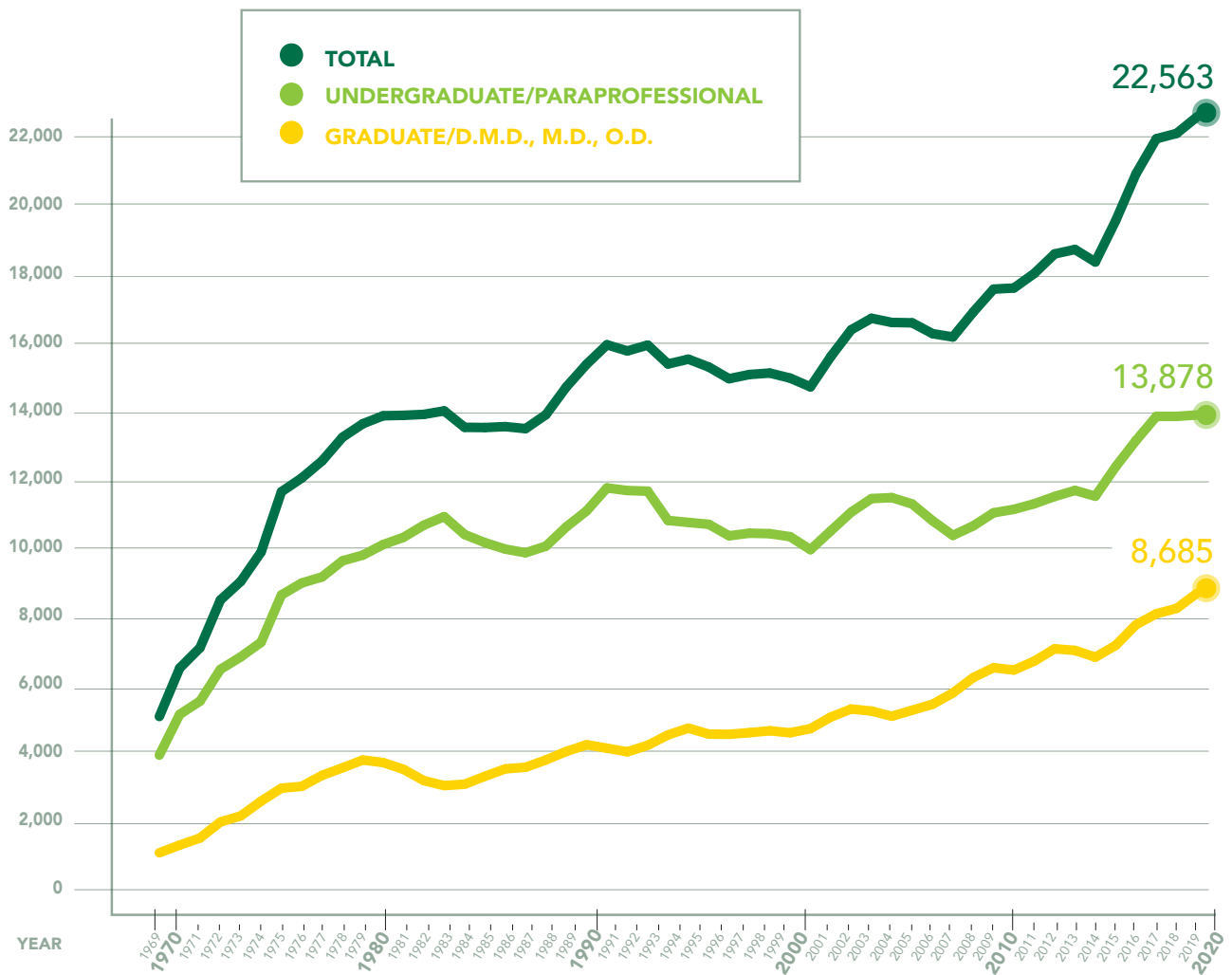

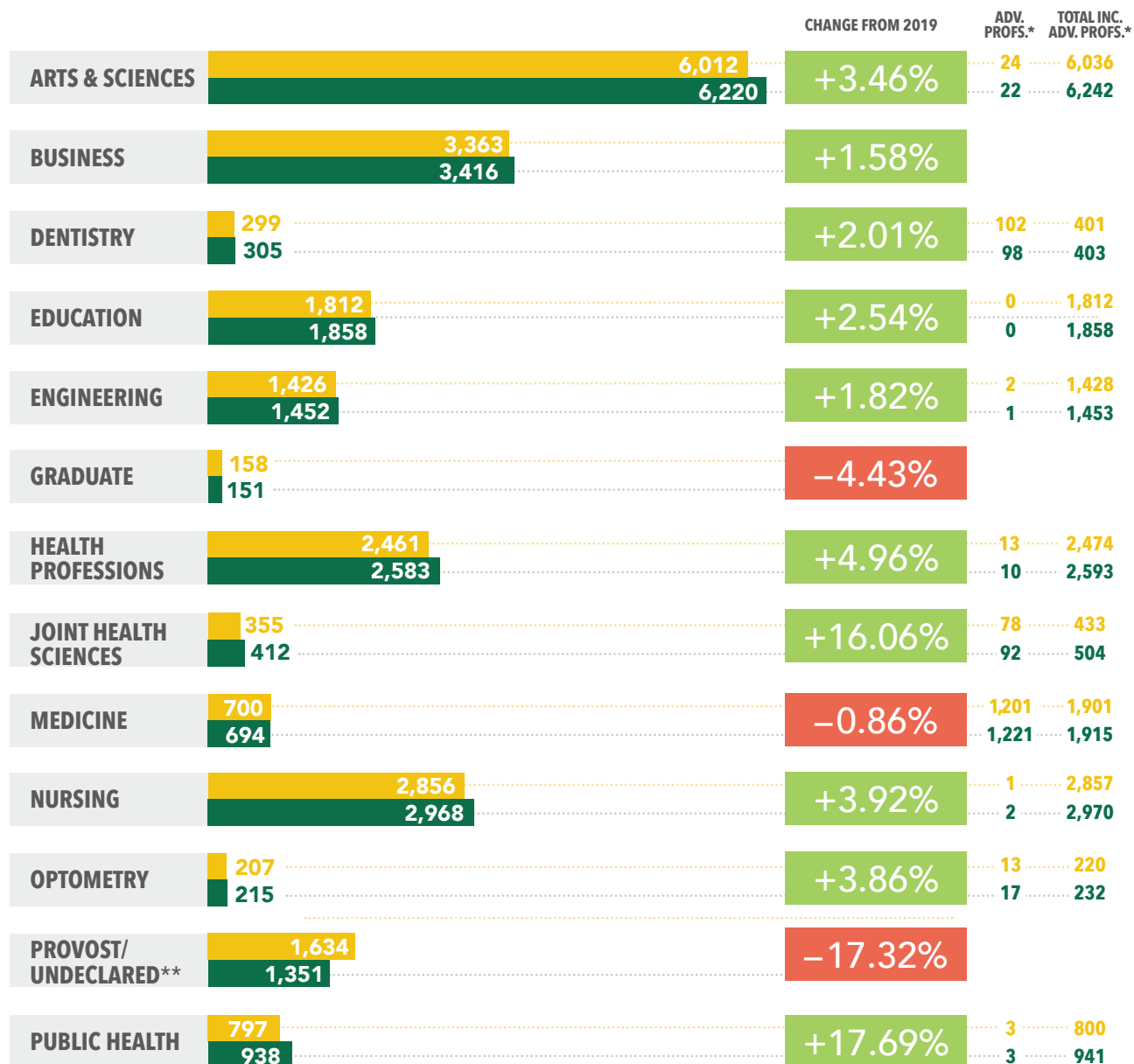

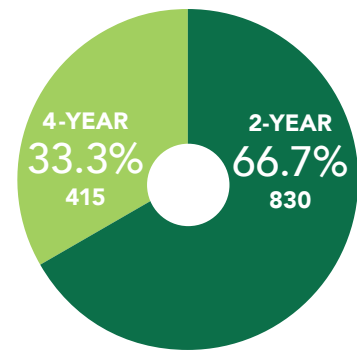
UAB ENTERING UNDERGRADUATE TRANSFER STUDENT DEMOGRAPHICS

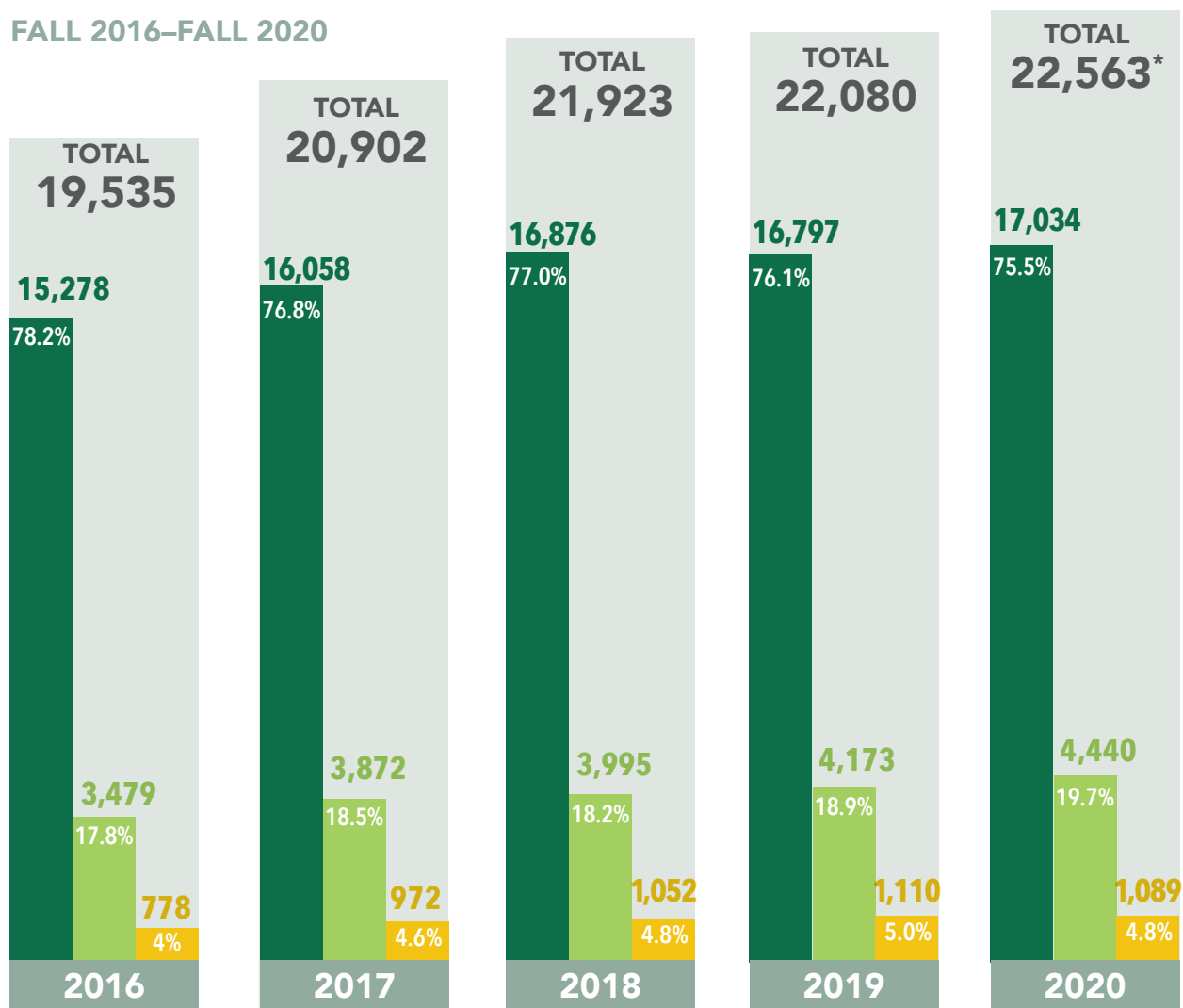

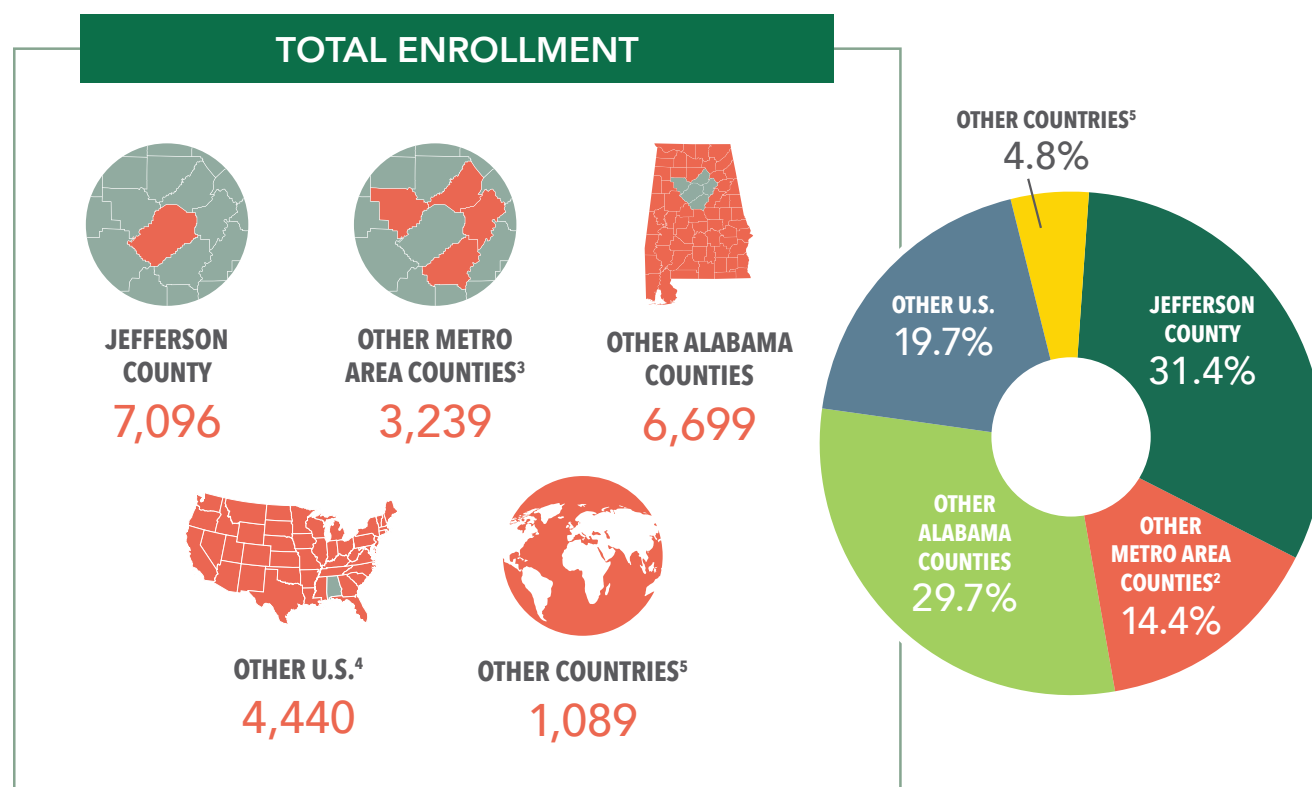

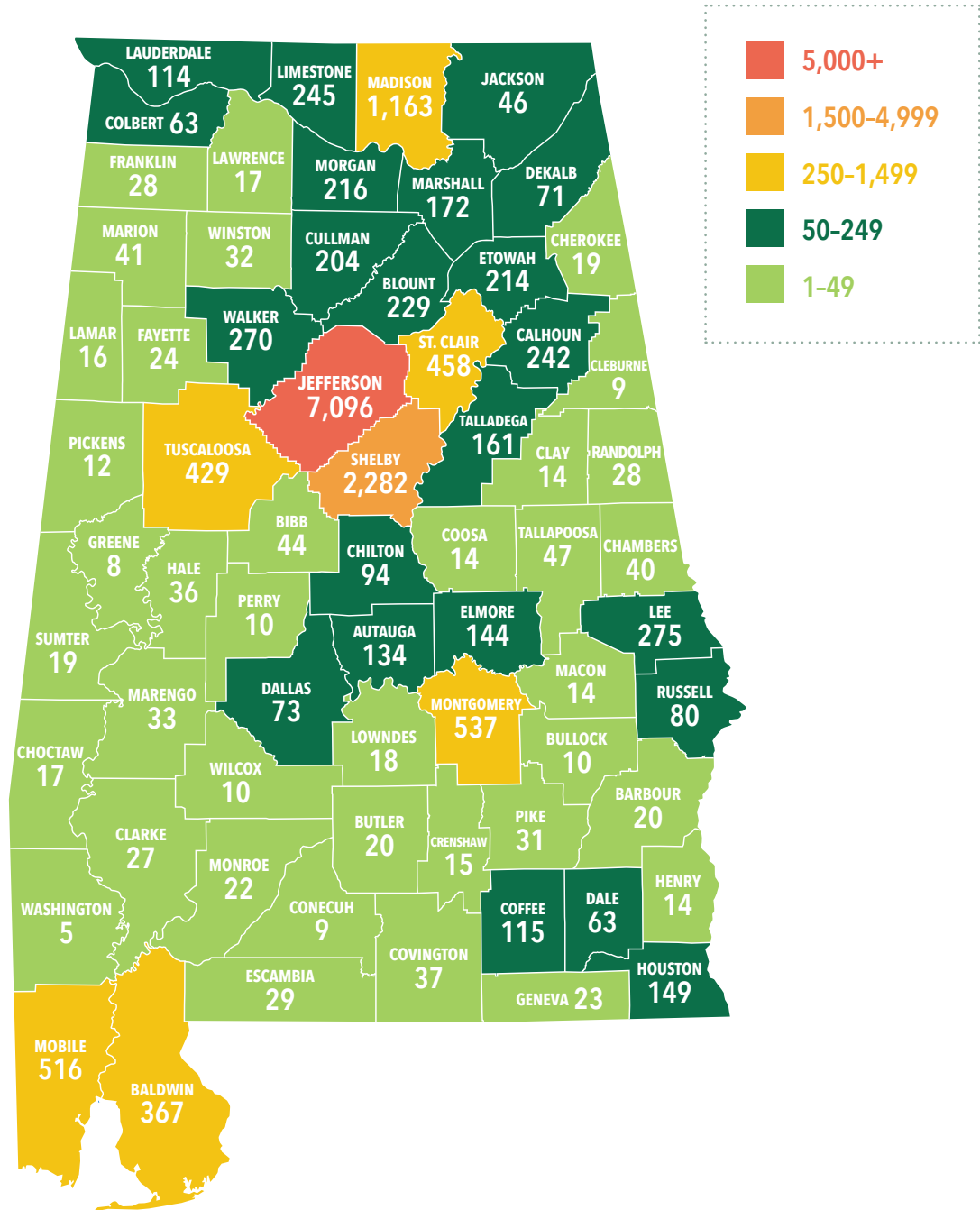

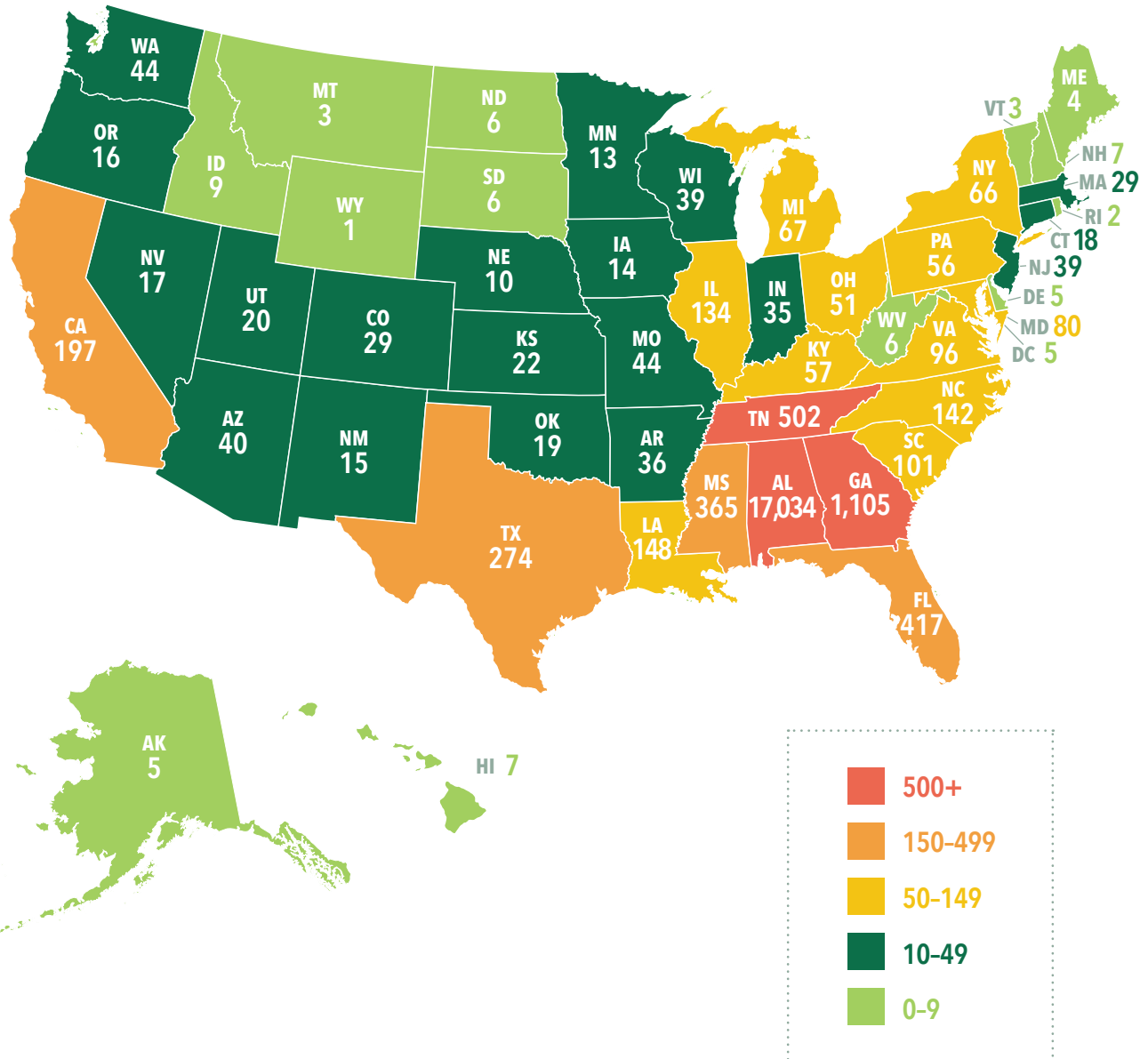

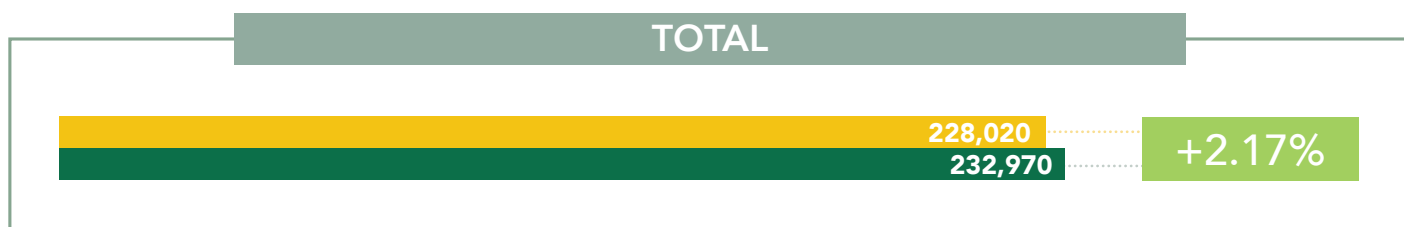
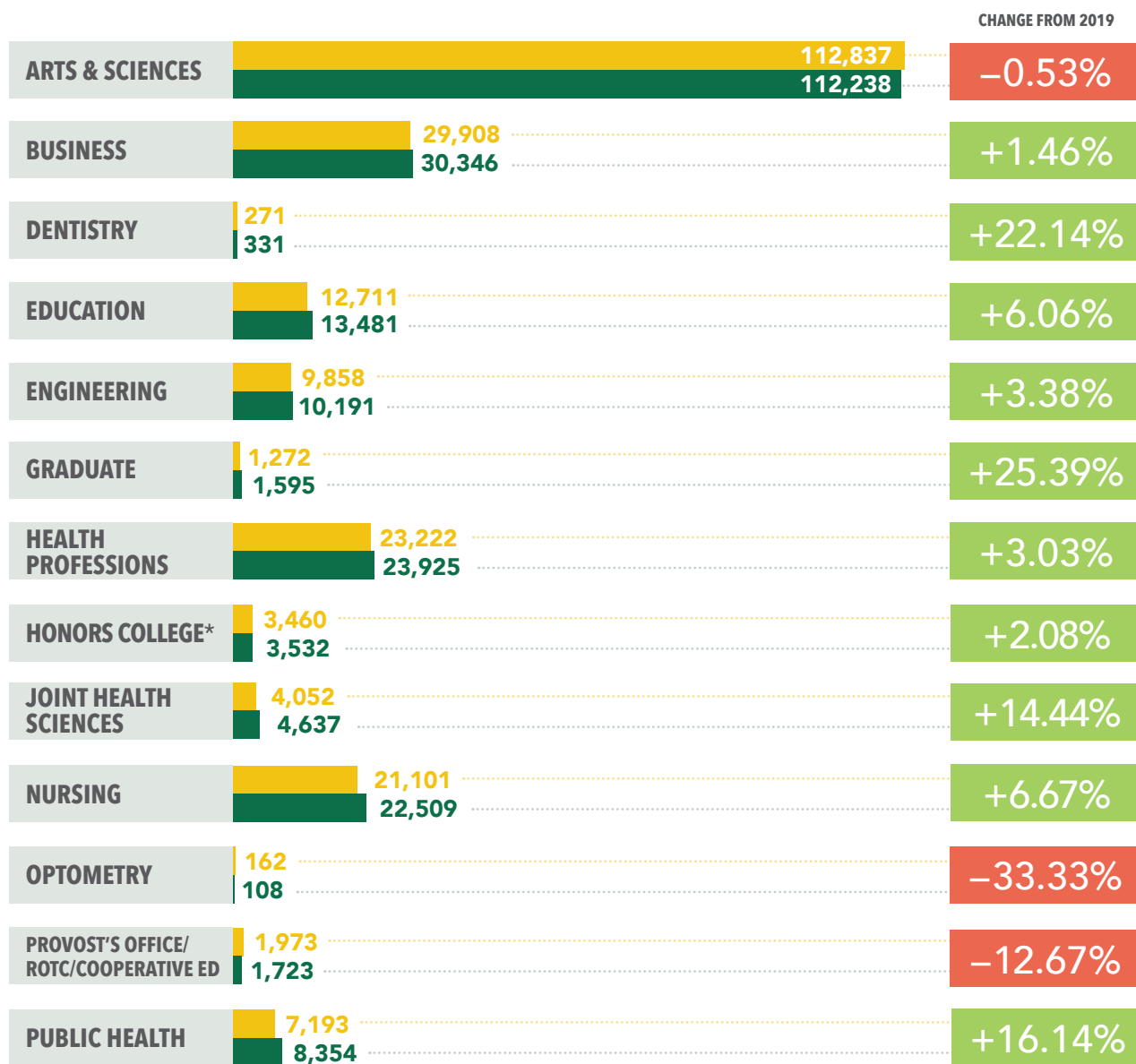

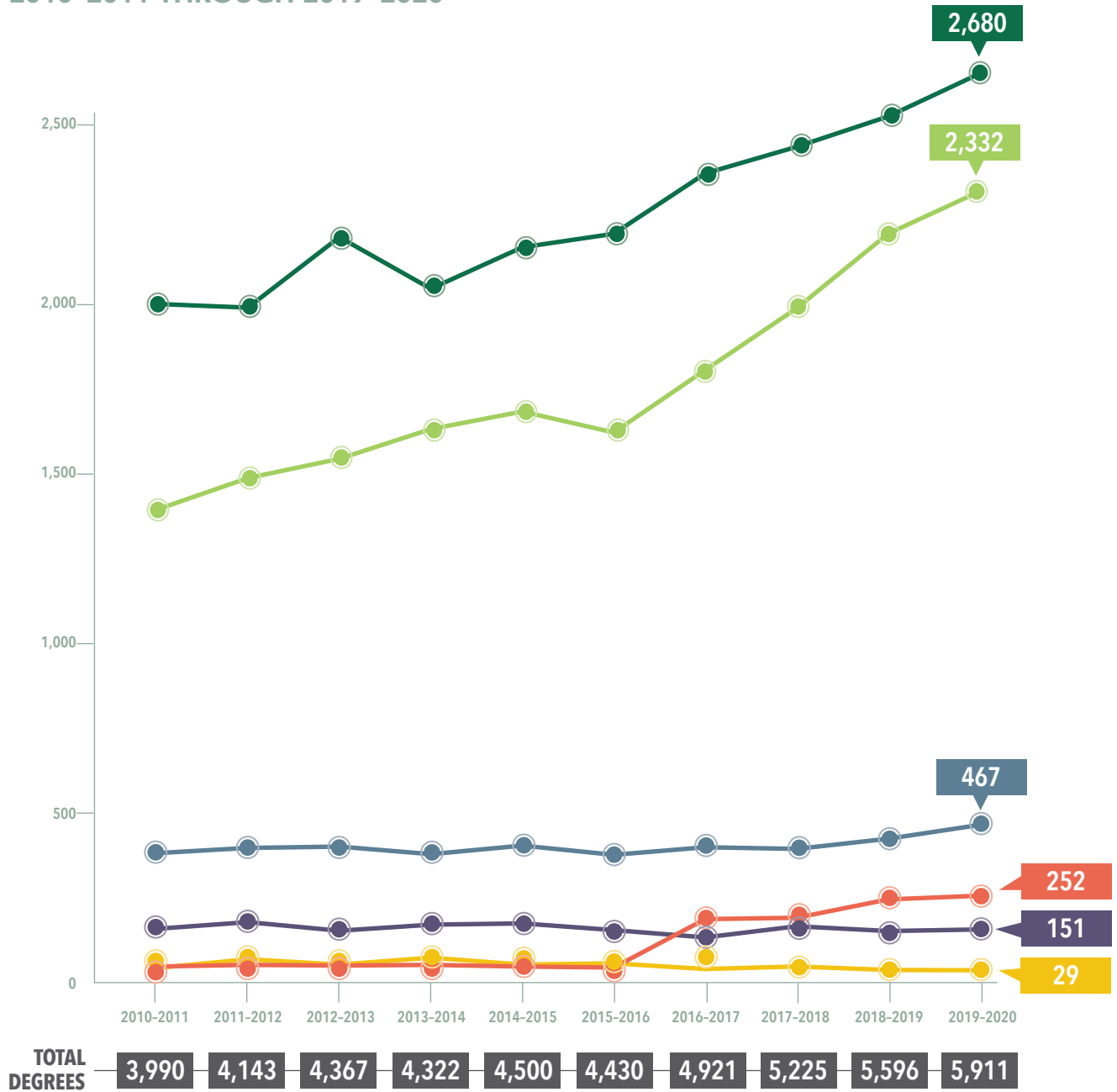

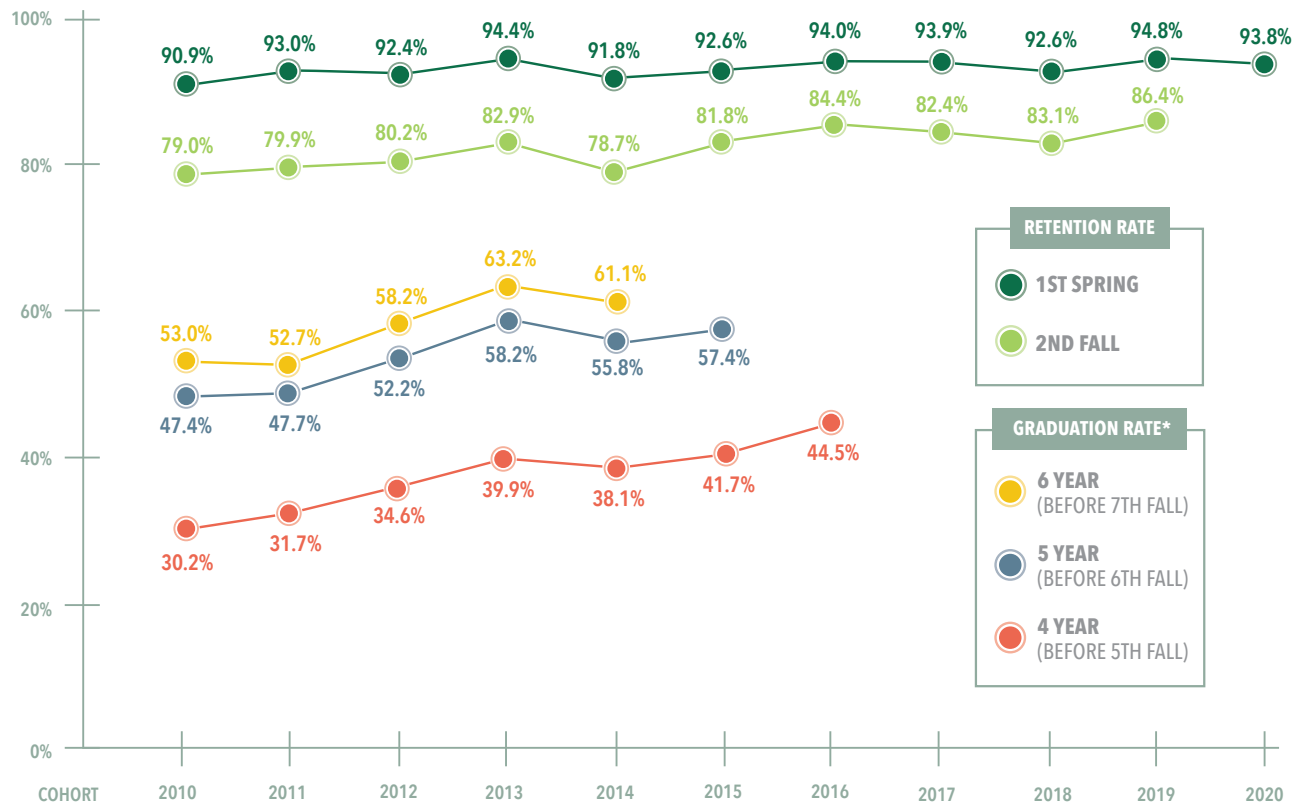

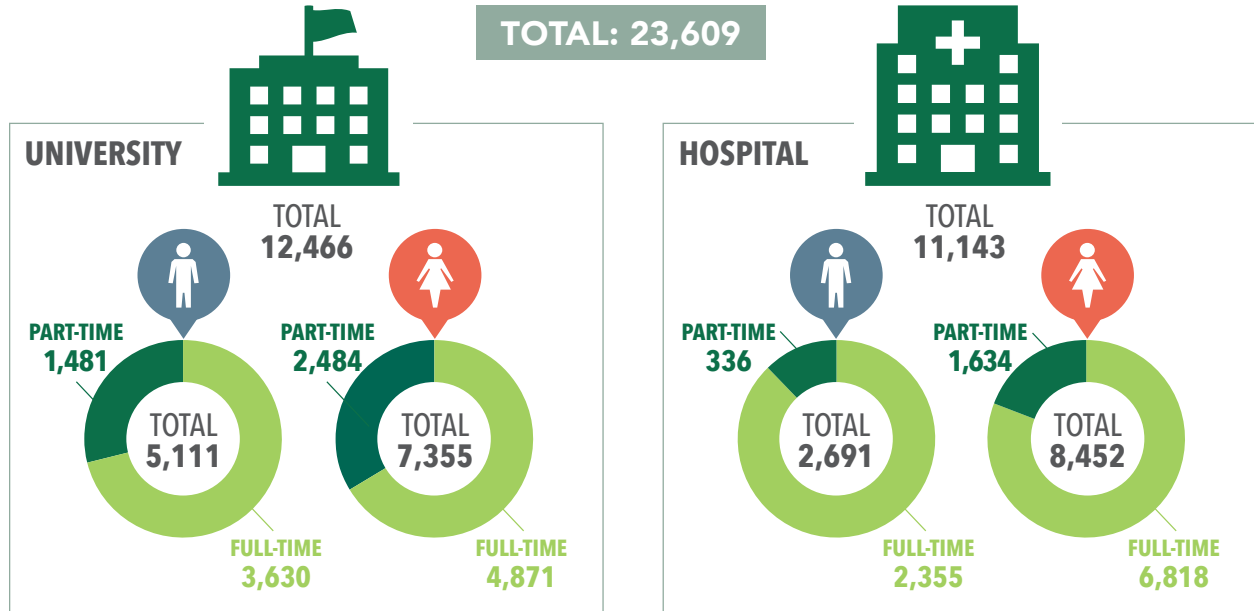

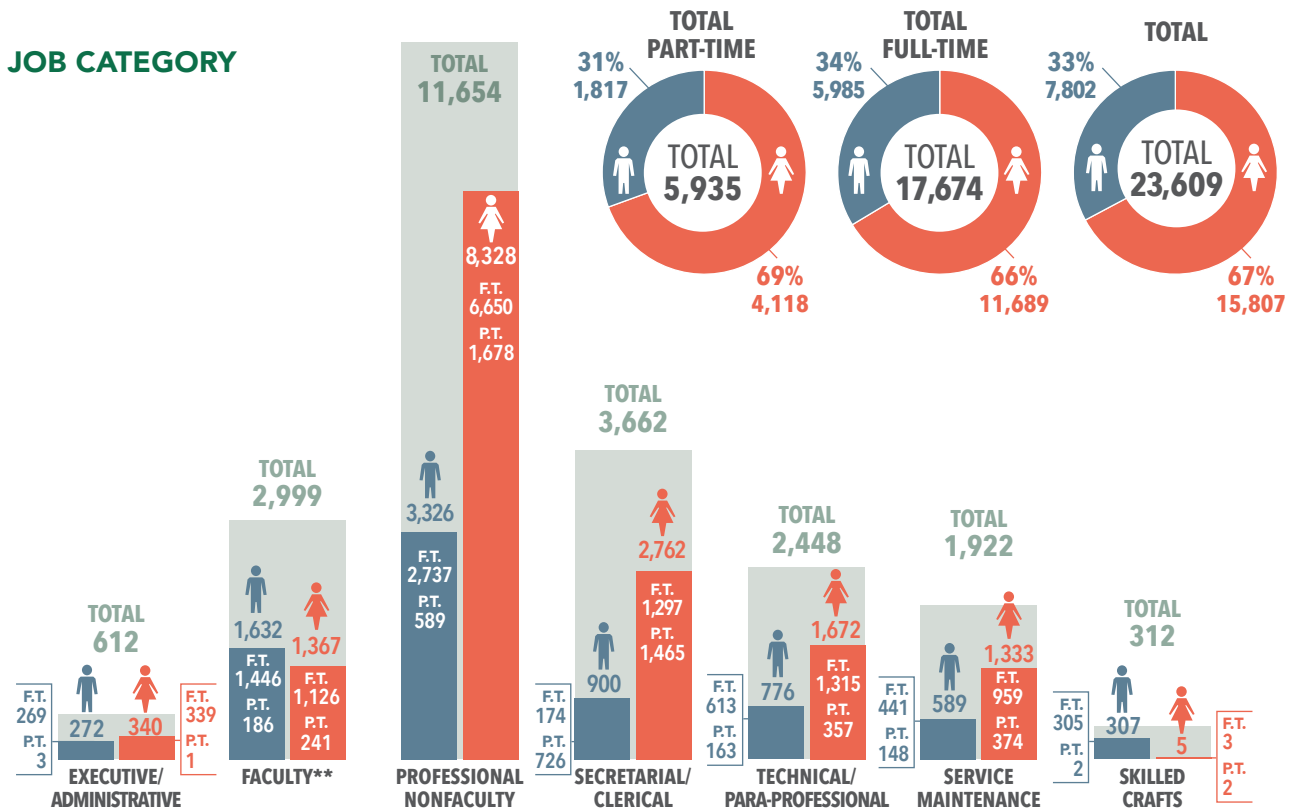

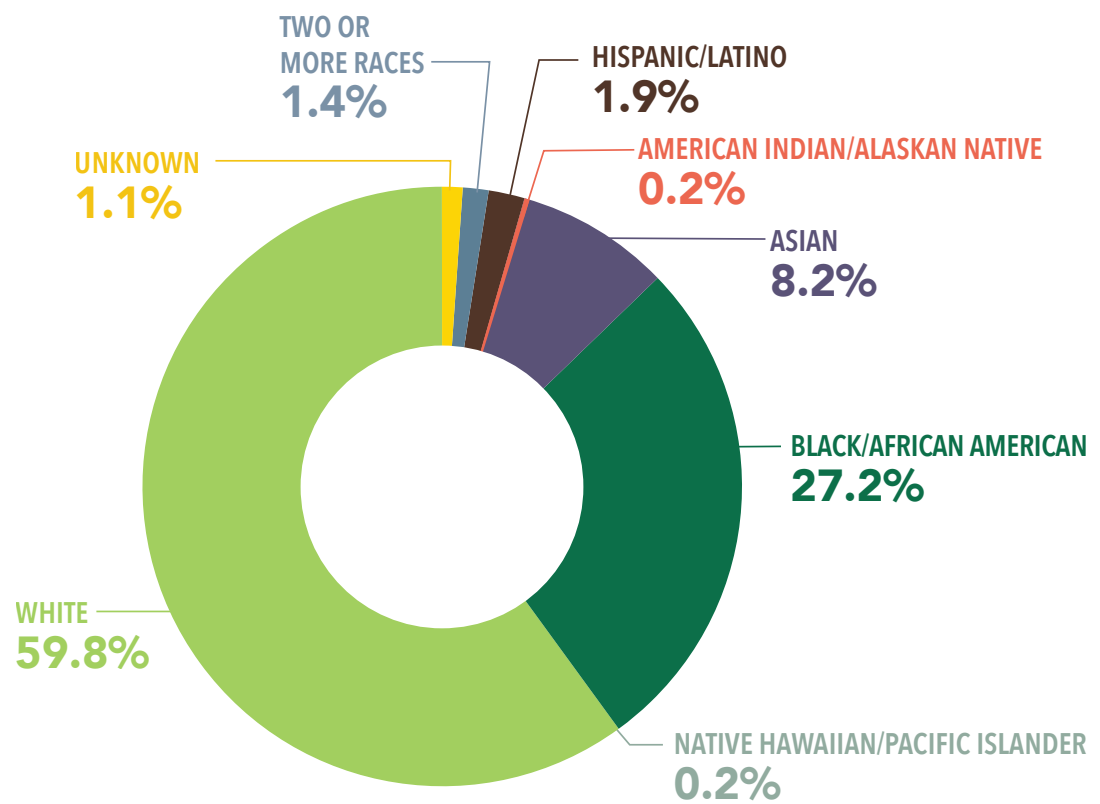

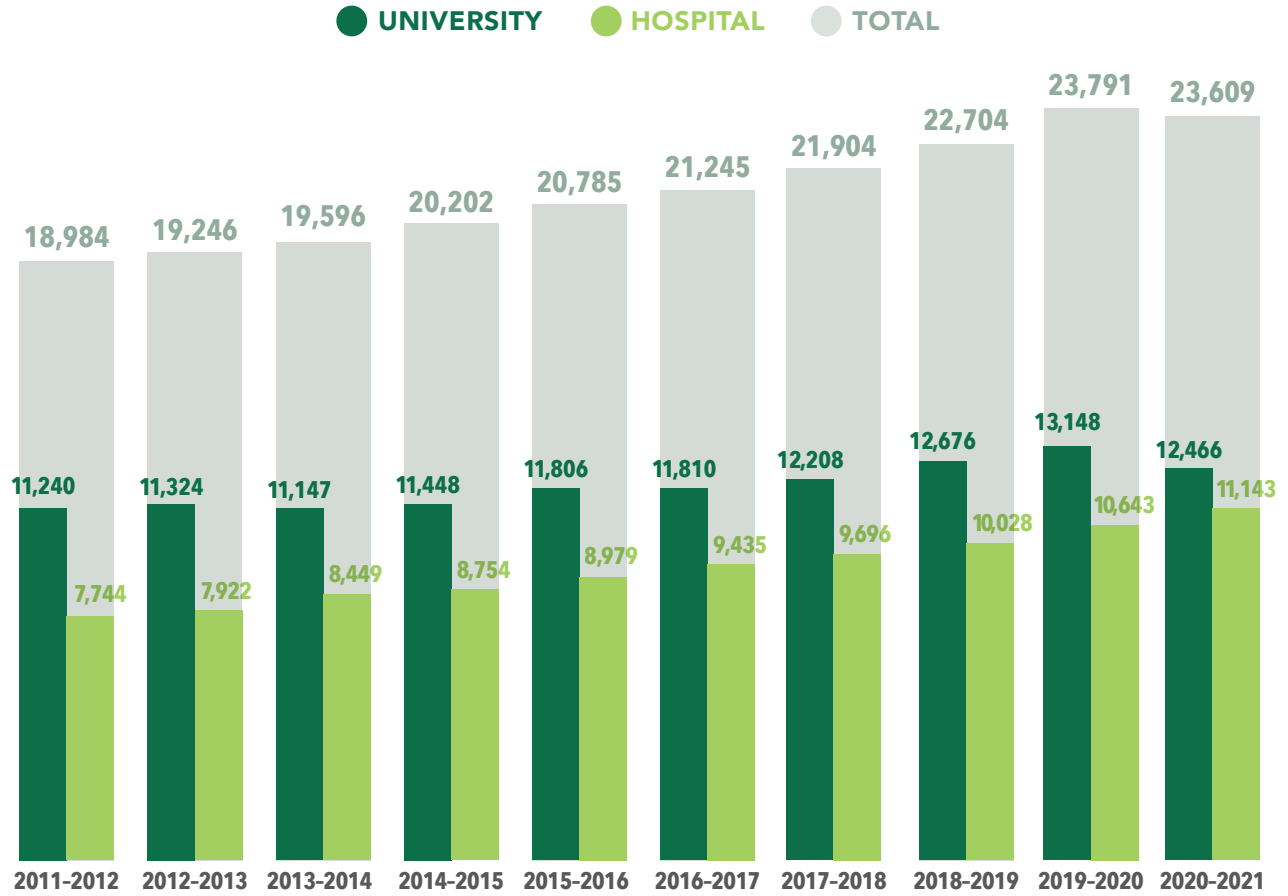

UAB WORK FORCE BY AREA

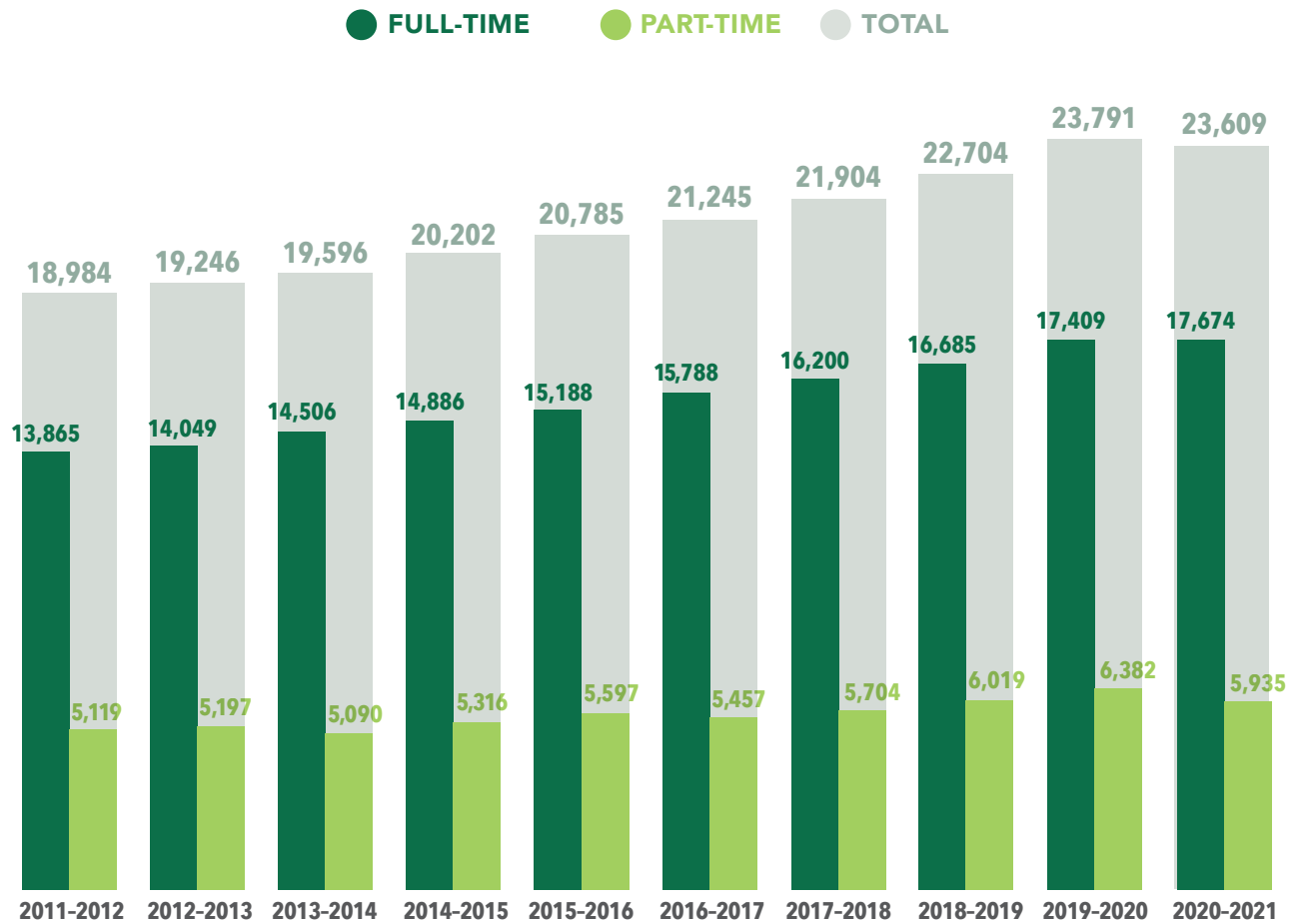
2011–2012 THROUGH 2020–2021

UAB WORK FORCE BY STATUS

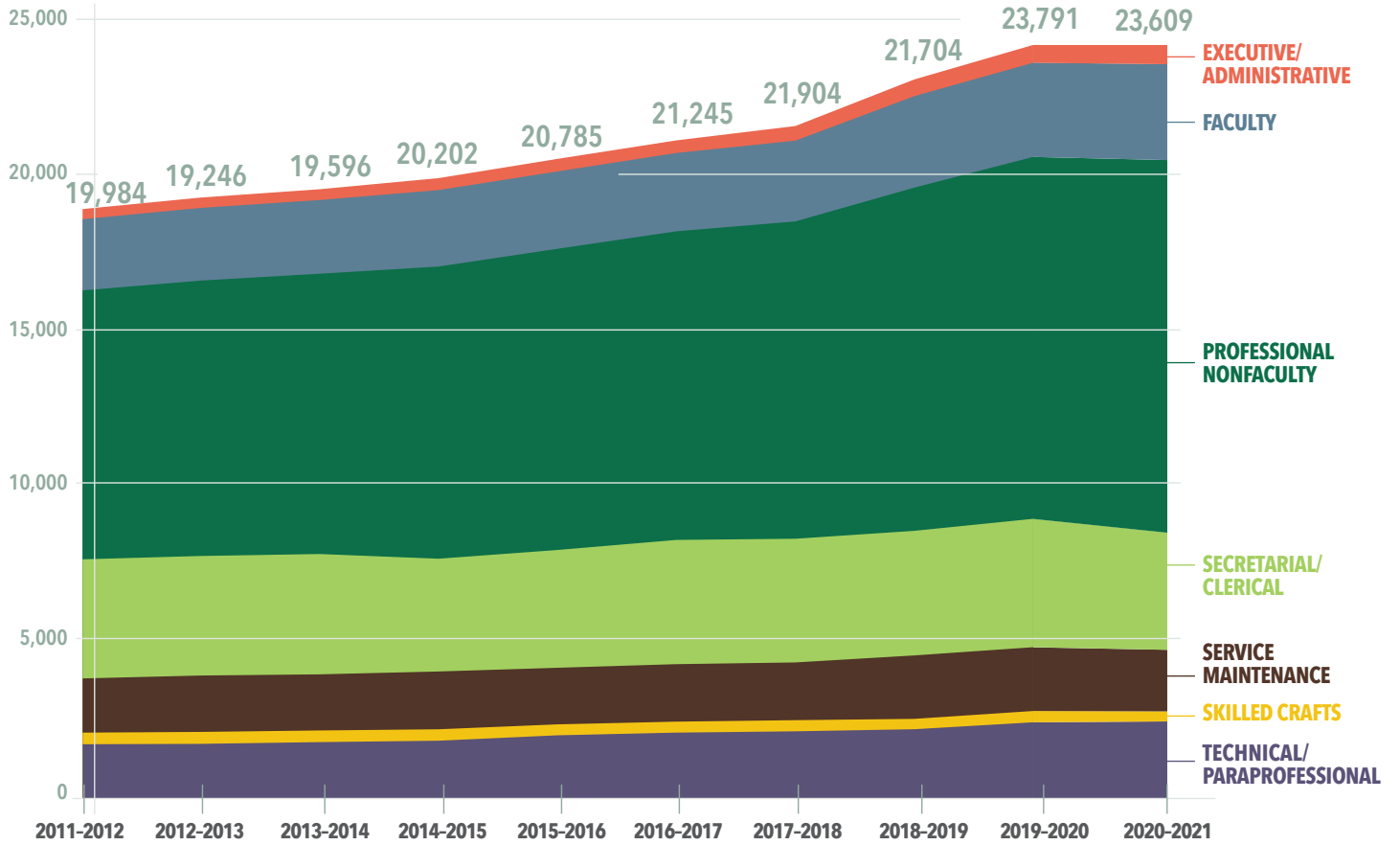
2011–2012 THROUGH 2020–2021

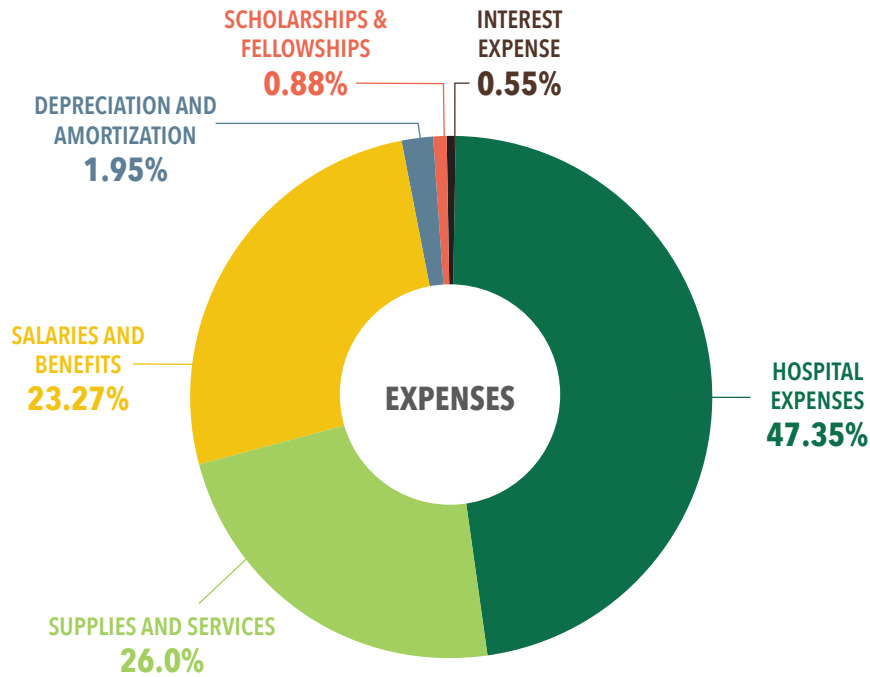
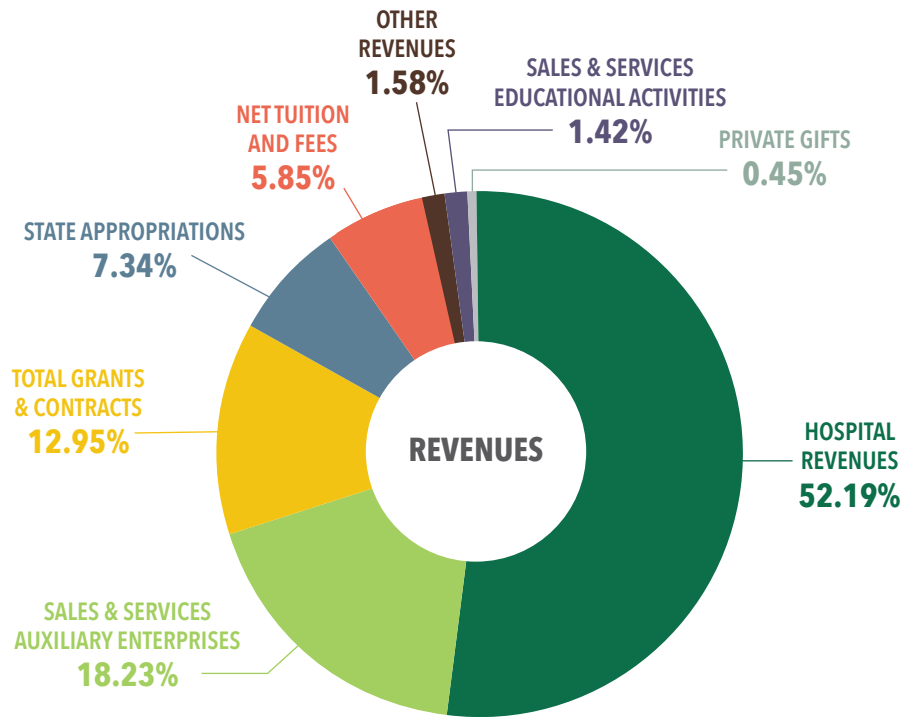

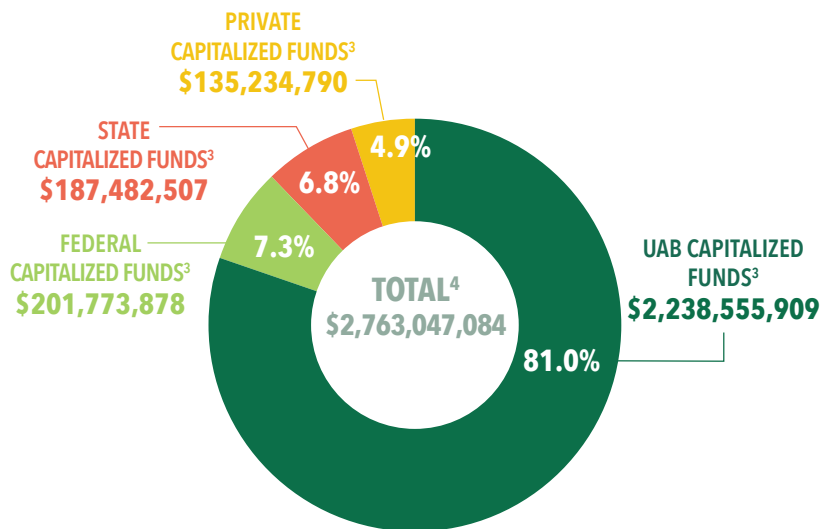
