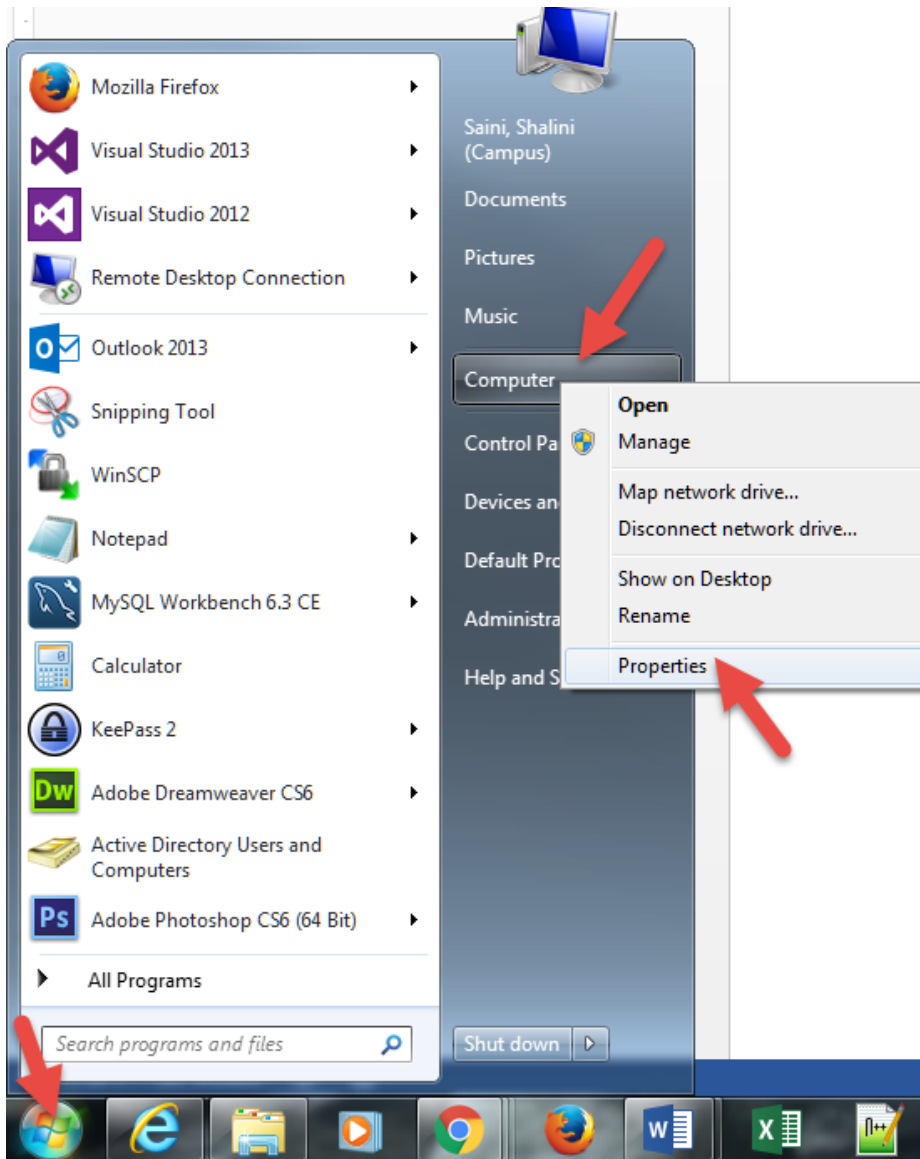



How to find your computer name in Windows 7, 8, 10, and Mac OS

Windows 7:

1. Click the Windows (start) icon in the bottom-left corner of your desktop and Right click on "Computer" and click on "Properties"



2. Your computer name will be listed in this panel.



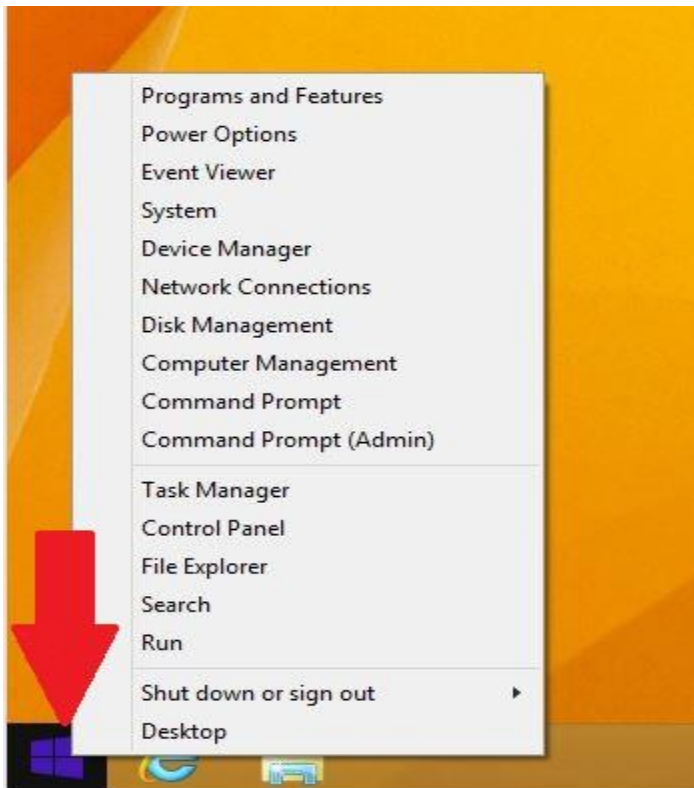

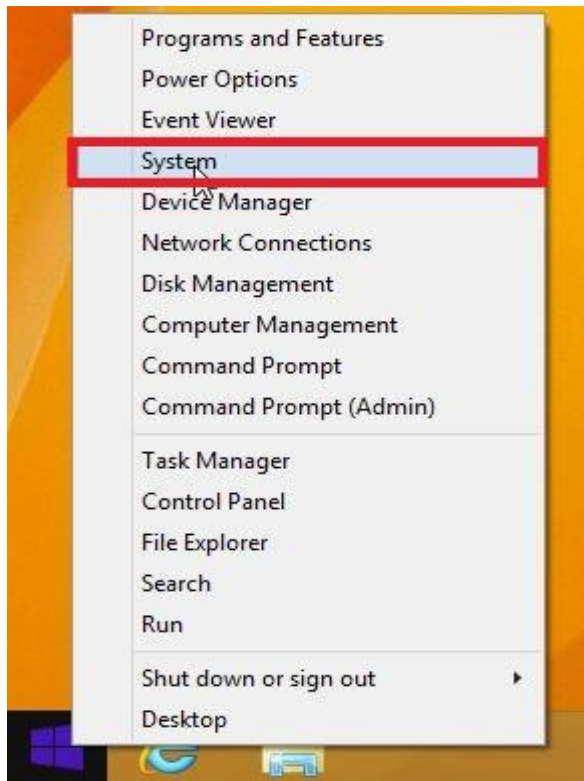

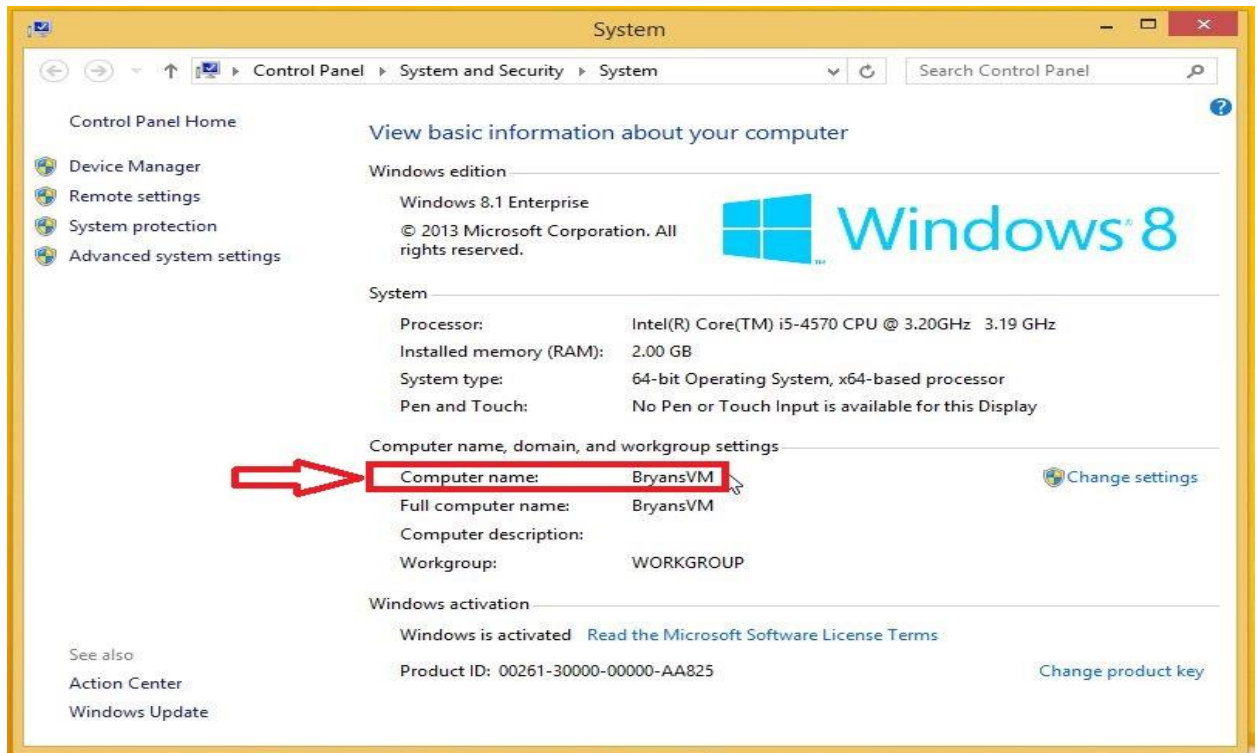
1. Right click on the Start menu in the bottom left corner:



2. Select "System" from the menu.

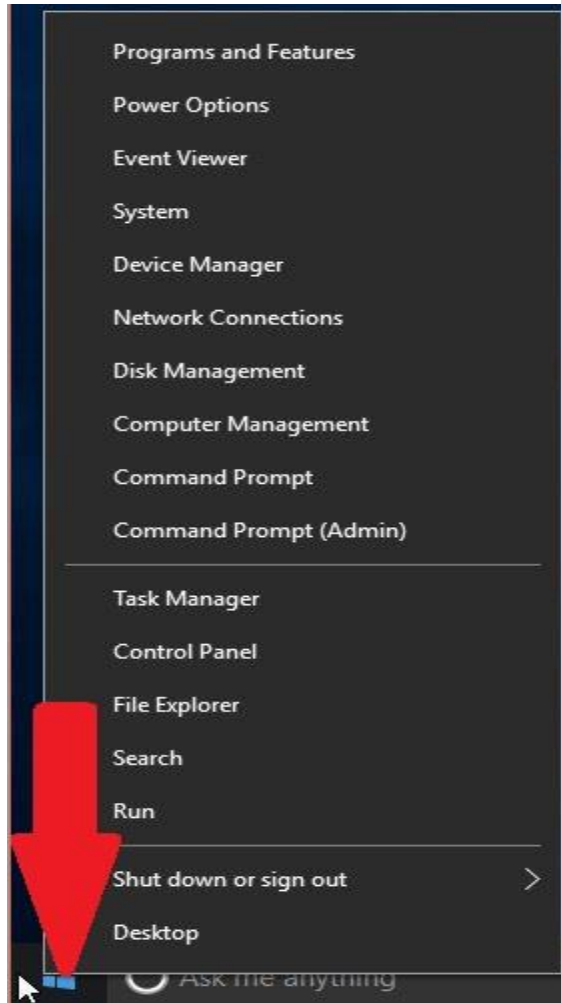

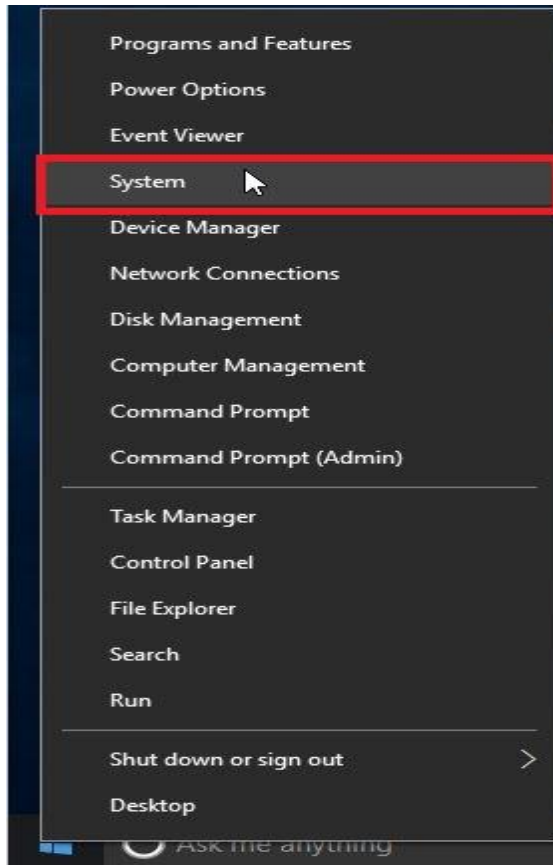

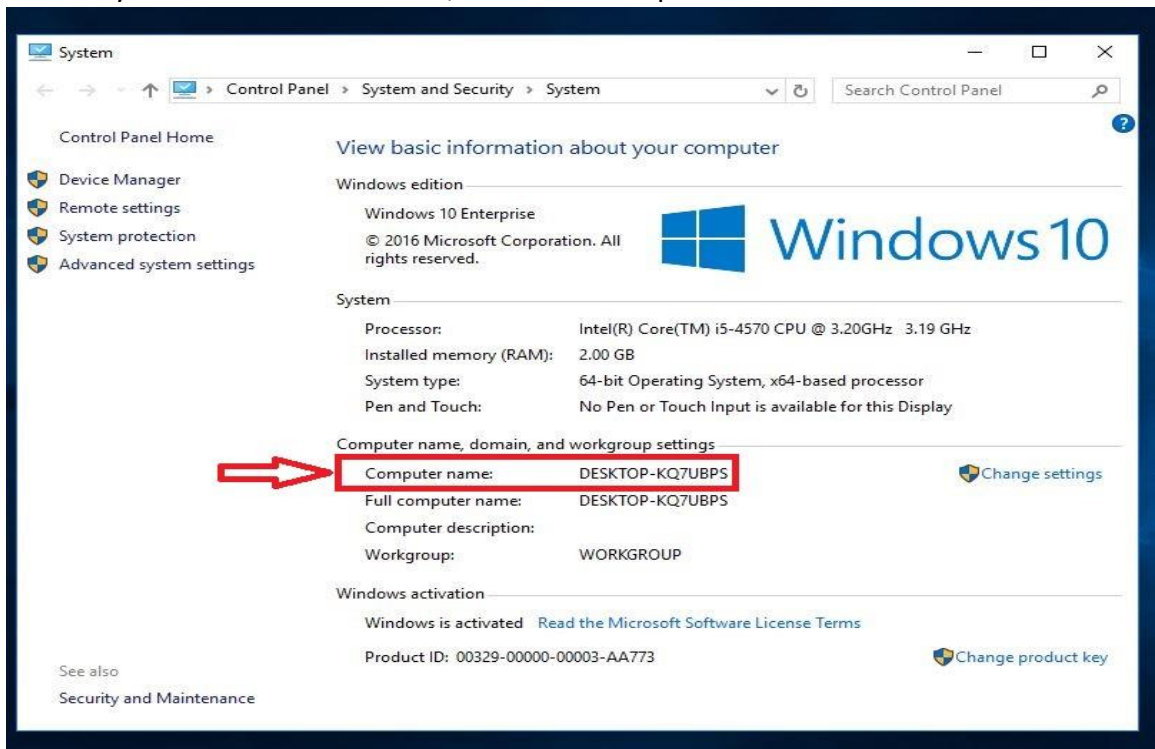
1. Right click on the Start menu in the bottom left corner:



2. Select "System" from the menu.

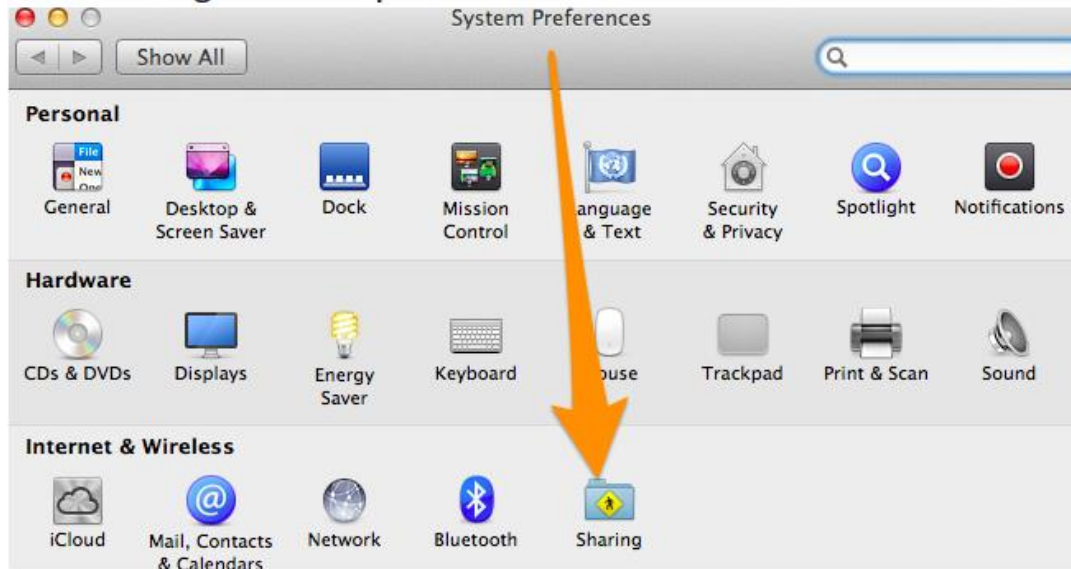
